

PROCEDURES FOR LETTER OF SUPPORT INQUIRY REQUESTS

Step 1 – Request submitted to TG-FSC: RCD of TC (District Manager) or Glenn County RCD (Executive Officer); request must include both A. and B. below.

- A. Letter of Support Inquiry Request Form (PDF or Word version) **We found the fillable PDF was a little challenging in completing / font size too small to read
- B. Sample Letter of Support (Word version)

Step 2 – TG-FSC Ad Hoc Committee "Tehama County" representatives review and provide input on Tehama projects, "Glenn County" representatives review and provide input on Glenn projects

Step 3 – TG-FSC Ad Hoc Committee "Tehama County" representatives email final draft letters on TG-FSC letterhead with their recommendations included in email, vice versa

Step 4 – TG-FSC Ad Hoc Committee ALL review recommendation and make a decision – YES or NO

Step 5 – Once agreed upon, if YES, TG-FSC Ad Hoc Committee member "Fire Coordinator" from other county would execute and email back to all

Step 6 – If NO, TG-FSC Ad Hoc Committee provides recommendations for project improvement

Grant Selection Committee,

The Tehama Glenn Firesafe Council (TGFSC) would like to express support of the Resource Conservation District of Tehama County's (RCDTC) **Finley Fuel Reduction Partnership (FFRP)**.

We understand that the proposed FFRP is an implementation project that will address critical fireshed and watershed health, and management needs through landscape-level mastication and biomass treatments. Doing so will help protect communities, public and private forestlands, and ongoing management efforts from the impacts of high severity wildfire. The FFRP ties in with completed treatments along Highway 36E.

As a collective of landowners, agencies, local government, land managers, timber operators, and community-based organizations within Tehama and Glenn counties, the TGFSC recognizes the importance of treating large-scale vegetation as a critical tactic in safeguarding WUI zone communities and forest health. While the proposed work will occur on Sierra Pacific Industries (SPI) private timberland, public and other private landowners will benefit from the proposed work. The adjacent communities of Sky Ranch, Lassen Lodge and Paynes Creek to the west as well as neighboring Lassen National Forest (LNF) will benefit from the treatment. By modifying the vegetation profile as proposed, the FFRP will help influence wildfire behavior providing more favorable conditions for fire personnel and land managers. Furthermore, the FFRP will help safeguard valuable economic and ecologic infrastructure.

RCDTC, SPI, and LNF are active TGFSC stakeholders and values our collaborative, including educational outreach and forest health initiatives and the local and landscape level. We believe that funding this proposal supports TGFSC's values.
